B. Digging Deeper and Application

- 1. In Philippians 1:27 Paul urges the Philippians to:
 - i) Stand fast in one spirit
 - ii) Have one mind striving together for the faith of the Gospel.

Explain what you understand from these two phrases.

- **2.** The first part of verse 27 reads "let your conduct be worthy of the Gospel of Christ...." How can we apply this to our day to day lives?
- **3.** As we conduct ourselves in a manner worthy of the Gospel, we may encounter opposition. What does Paul advise when we face such opposition or adversity? **Philippians 1:28**
- 4. From your own understanding, where do you think suffering comes from?
- **5.** Have you ever suffered physically or had to give up something because of your Christian faith? Share with the group.
- 6. Why do you think people blame God for their own mistakes? Proverbs 19:3, 15 NLT
- 7. In 1 Peter 2:23-24 we read about Jesus suffering on our behalf. How can we differentiate between the sufferings we should bear ourselves and the suffering Jesus already paid for?

At whatever cost, let us always conduct ourselves in a manner worthy of the Gospel of Christ. We are living epistles and people all around us are reading our every move. If you suffer for living godly, endure it patiently because God is pleased!
